Day 1

Our journey to New England begins as you are met by our professional Bianco tour director and driver. A scenic drive will bring us to our home for the first night in Lewisburg, PA. During our journey we will make plenty of stops to stretch and eat and dinner is included at LaPrimavera. Be sure to get some rest as we are making our way to Cape Cod tomorrow.

Day 2

After an included breakfast this morning, we continue our journey to Hyannis, MA making rest and lunch stops en route for our comfort and convenience. Welcome to Massachusetts, the "Bay State" and home to the sandy shores of Cape Cod. In early November 1620, after two grueling months at sea, the Mayflower approached the tip of Cape Cod. For two days they tried to sail south but the treacherous waters along the Cape's outer coast forced them to return to the tip's safe harbor. We check into the Fairfield Inn Hyannis this afternoon, our home for the next four nights. Dinner is included tonight at a local restaurant.

Day 3

An Extended continental breakfast is included this morning at your leisure. Our local guide will meet us at our hotel and we will travel historic Route 6A, the Old King's Highway, a scenic byway winding through centuries of Cape Cod history. It winds past hundreds of historic structures which characterize its early development. View a windmill, a Cape Cod Lighthouse and visit the **Cape Cod National Seashore Visitor's Center**. After that, the sand dunes and the ocean surround us as we approach "Land's End" – **Provincetown**. We are now at the extreme tip of Cape Cod. Formerly known as the "Province Lands" the pilgrims landed here first before they decided to settle across the Bay in Plymouth. Take some time to enjoy the wonderful variety of restaurants, shops, and galleries that make this artists/fishermen village so unique. From there, those of us who are interested we will board an excursion vessel for an amazing

experience of **Whale Watching**. (3 hours) You will travel into the natural habitat of a diverse marine environment including birds that migrate here from all over the Atlantic, and fish which use these shallow waters to feed. Try to spot Humpback, Minke, and Fin Whales going about their daily business. An onboard naturalist will introduce you to everything you see and will answer any of your questions about the whales, birds, fish and lighthouses. Instead of whale watching, you may choose to stay on dry land:

Admission is included on a one-hour **Dune Tour** excursion. Ride through the protected lands of the Cape Cod National Seashore, the largest protected coastline in the country. Your driver/guide will point out the “dune shacks” where famous artists and writers became inspired to create their art. Dinner is included this evening.

Day 4

An Extended continental breakfast is included this morning at your leisure. Our local guide will meet us at our hotel and take us for a tour of **Hyannis**, including the John F. Kennedy Memorial, the Korean War Memorial, Hyannisport and a view of St. Francis Xavier Church, the summer parish of the Kennedy Family. Up next, admission is included to the **Whydah Pirate Museum**. The Whydah was a fully rigged galley ship that was built by the British. During one of its voyages in 1717, it was captured by the famed pirate Samuel “Black Sam” Bellamy. During an infamous storm off the coast of Cape Cod the Whydah sank, laying its treasure just 500 feet off the shore for over 300 years. Now you can touch and see the world’s only authenticated pirate treasure. There will be free time on Main Street for lunch and shopping on your own. We will then travel to **Sandwich** – the oldest town on Cape Cod. We will view the Sandwich Village Green, the Great Salt Marsh, a Cranberry Bog, and Cape Cod Bay. Sandwich became the site of one of America’s largest glass factories, an industry that flourished during the 19th century. This quaint and quiet seaside community is the hometown of Thornton Burgess, naturalist and author of 170 children’s books. After that, a stop will be made at the **Cape Cod Canal Visitor’s Center**. Explore the rich history, fascinating features, and vigilant operation of the Cape Cod Canal. The center

features a retired 41-foot US Army Corps of Engineers patrol boat, a 46-seat theater, canal critters, canal wildflowers, real time radar, camera images and rocking chairs on an observation deck. We will have some time set aside to stroll around the village. A dinner buffet is included this evening at the **Historic Dan’l Webster Inn**.

Day 5

Another extended continental breakfast is included this morning at your leisure. Our local guide will meet us at our hotel and we will travel to **Wareham**. We’ll begin our day with a **Cranberry Bog Tour** by A.D. Makepeace, the world’s largest cranberry grower. Our guide will show us examples of an existing bog, currently in production and will discuss the stages of the cranberry growing process. There are two methods of harvesting, and you may even see it happening. Learn from the expert cranberry growers about farming and harvesting this fruit named “cranberry” by the Pilgrims. From here we will travel to America’s Hometown – **Plymouth** for lunch on our own.

Home of our Pilgrim Fathers and one of the country’s first settlements, it is well known in the United States for its historical value. A picture stop will be made at the Forefather’s Monument, the largest, solid granite monument in the United States. She stands facing the harbor, welcoming those who come by water. A picture stop will also be made at Plymouth Rock, the traditional site of disembarkation of the Pilgrims in 1620 and the Mayflower II, a reproduction of the ship that brought the Pilgrims to the New World. Then we will board a **Lobster Tales Cruise** to learn about the many creatures that live-in Plymouth Harbor. Experience a “hands on” approach to see how lobsters are harvested from their natural environment. Roll up your sleeves to help haul in lobster traps. Dinner is included this evening.

Day 6

We depart this morning after our included breakfast and begin our journey toward home, stopping overnight in Rochester, New York where we will enjoy an included dinner.

Day 7

After breakfast on our own this morning, we will complete our journey home making rest and meal stops en route for comfort and convenience. Thank you for travelling with Bianco!
